Loren Spielman was born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, and completed his doctoral work in Ancient Jewish History at the Graduate School of the Jewish Theological Seminary. In 2009-10, he taught as a visiting professor in the religion department at Wesleyan University. In the fall of 2010, he joined the faculty of Portland State University as a Schusterman Teaching Fellow in Jewish Studies and Assistant Professor of Classical Judaism. Professor Spielman's scholarly interests center on the political, social and cultural history of Jews living under Persian, Greek and Roman rule. His dissertation, supported by a grant from the Foundation for Jewish Culture, examines the pivotal role that Jewish attitudes towards Greek and Roman theater, athletic competition, gladiators and other popular entertainments played in the formation of Jewish identity in Roman Palestine.
