Our Scholars-in-Residence

Rena Lauer and Kevin (Yiftakh) Osterloh are assistant professors of history and religious studies at

Oregon State University. Prof. Lauer earned her PhD and MA in Harvard's history department. Prof. Osterloh earned his PhD from Princeton's religion department, and his MA in Jewish Studies from NYU. Profs. Lauer and Osterloh are also married, having met while working together on a medieval Hebrew text, *Sefer Hasidim*, at Princeton University.

Prof. Lauer specializes in the medieval Mediterranean, with a focus on Jewish-Christian relations and Jewish identity on Venetian Crete. She is finishing a book tentatively titled *The Jews of Medieval Crete: Religious Encounter and Legal Culture in the Venetian Mediterranean.*

Prof. Osterloh specializes in the ancient Mediterranean, with a focus on aspects of Jewish identity resulting from the interactions of Jews with Greeks and Romans. He works in eight languages across Jewish and ancient history from the First Temple period through the Rabbinic period.
